Kirwan Institute Awards Grant

Adrienne Dixson, Ph.D., Assistant Professor in the School of Teaching and Learning, is the latest recipient of funding from the Kirwan Institute Small Grants Program. Dixson will conduct a study entitled *Do You Know What It Means to Miss New Orleans?: Rebuilding Public Education in Post-Katrina New Orleans*.

Dixson's on-site research in New Orleans will involve a series of interviews to gauge the post-Katrina impact of New Orleans' hybrid model of public schooling, which includes both traditional public schools and charter schools. Her research will assess the resulting impact on communities of color, in terms of educational and racial equity.

The Kirwan Institute Small Grants Program is designed to support research which will deepen the understanding of racial and ethnic disparities at the local, national and international levels.
